
Dosbarth Draenog

We have also made the most of the sunny showers by exploring colour mixing to create our own rainbows.




Dosbarth Robin Goch (Year 3)

We've been busy exploring the the theme of acceptance in our class book and have enjoyed drama activities and creating puppet shows to help us to retell the story.






Dosbarth Eryr (Year 5)


