


Newsletter Friday 27th September



Class News- Adventurers Phase



We started our week by working together to programme our Micro:bit compasses using what we learned last week. It was wonderful to see the class working so well together to help each other. Next we looked at the purpose of a compass and what each reading means- for example why we needed to input '<45 degrees' to obtain a reading of North. This led to our work on angles where we have learned to recognise full, quarter and half turns along with the associated number of degrees. We've also learned how to recongise right angles, acute angles and obtuse angles.

We've used Talk for Writing to map out our stories then used 'innovate' to adapt them with our own ideas. We've started to write our story openers and are uplevelling these using some of the words that we found when we practised using a thesaurus earlier this week.

We are really growing on confidence in our swimming sessions now. Our swimming teachers in Chirk are blown away by the progress that we've made during our lessons so far.

Dosbarth Eryr (Year 5)


This week in literacy we have been introduced to our new story 'Journey to the River Sea'. We have predicted what we think the story might be about and what themes might be present throughout the story. Miss Weaver was very impressed with all the wonderful ideas that the children had.

In our topic work we have begun our new topic 'Life Below Water'. We have worked in groups to gather all our ideas about what we already know about life below water, and we have researched the question 'Why is our planet blue?'. We have created our own databases on the computer by researching the different rivers in Wales and collecting information on paper. We then inputted this data onto a database using the computers.

On Thursday, we celebrated European Languages Day. We found out what languages were spoken in Europe and how many people speak these languages. We then used this information to compare and order the languages spoken in Europe.

Finally, yesterday we joined an adobe live lesson where we attempted to create a video about some of the different countries in Europe and had a go at using the translator feature to translate our writing. We definitely learnt lots of new skills from this lesson and even got a shout out!







Dosbarth Barcud (Year 6)




