
Class News- Explorers Phase


Dosbarth Wiwer

We have also been sketching and painting some beautiful daffodil pictures.






Dosbarth Llwynog (Year 2)


In maths, we have been using tessellation to create a new

It's been Marvellous Mountains week in Year 4. We've been learning the legend of how Snowdon got it's name. Did you know that Yr Wyddfa means tomb? We do now, and we know that legend has it that the giant 'Rhitta Gawr' is buried beneath the mountain.

We've done lots of creative writing linked to the story of Rhitta Gawr, including diary entries, stories and descriptions of the horrible creatures in Rhitta's army.

We've also researched other mountains in Wales to compare the height of Snowdon with them; then we compared Snowdon with other mountains around the world and calculated the difference in height using our subtraction skills.

We've created databases based on the mountains, and we've been exploring the artwork of Mary Lloyd Jones including the use of the Bardic alphabet to hide the stories of the landscape in her work. We are going to be working on our own art inspired by Mary Lloyd Jones today!

This week we have been busy completing work for the E-steddfod.

In literacy, we have been applying everything we have learnt about writing descriptively and used this to describe the Aqueduct. Our first drafts are looking good, but we are going to improve them and write our final version today.
